

To ensure the health and safety of our staff and students, we have implemented several new policies:

- Student temperatures are checked each morning with wall-mounted thermometers. (Think speed-traps for temperature.)
- The classrooms have been expanded to allow every student a private work station, complete with personal sanitizing and cleaning supplies.
- Moving into Everest has provided a surplus of space for social distancing!
- Masks are worn inside the Base Camp facility at all times, (except during lunch.) Base Camp masks were provided by Ms. Dean Huckaby, who worked as a seamstress from 1964-1973 inside the factory building that has become Everest.
- If any student, staff, or immediate family member tests positive for COVID-19, that individual transitions to virtual learning, (or teaching,) for 2 weeks.
